Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. Nazareth ISD offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.85; lunch costs **\$3.00 for K-5 and \$3.25 for 6-12**. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced-price meals. Reduced-price is \$0.30\$ for breakfast and \$0.40\$ for lunch. If you received a notification letter that a child is directly certified for free or reduced-price meals, do not complete an application. Let the school know if any children in the household attending school are not listed in the letter.

The questions and answers that follow and attached directions provide additional information on how to complete the application. Complete only <u>one application</u> for all the students in the household and return the completed application to Carolyn Wilhelm, PO Box 189, Nazareth TX; 945-2231. 1. Who Can Get Free Meals?

- *Income*—Children can get free or reduced-price meals if a household's gross income is within the limits described in the *Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines*.
- Special Assistance Program Participants—Children in households receiving benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Food Distribution Program for Households on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), are eligible for free meals.
- *Foster*—Foster children who are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- *Head Start or Early Head Start*—Children participating in these programs are eligible for free meals.
- *Homeless, Runaway, and Migrant*—Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant qualify for free meals. If you haven't been told about a child's status as homeless, runaway, or migrant or you feel a child may qualify for one of these programs, please call or email 945-2231 jane.gerber@nazarethisd.net.
- *WIC Recipient*—Children in households participating in WIC <u>may</u> be eligible for free or reduced-price meals.
- 2. What If I Disagree With the School's Decision About My Application? Talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to Dr. Kara Garlitz, PO Box 189, Nazareth TX; 945-2231; kara.garlitz@nazarethisd.net.
- 3. *My Child's Application Was Approved Last Year. Do I Need To Fill Out A New One?* Yes. An application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. Send in a new application unless the school has told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.

- 4. *If I Don't Qualify Now, May I Apply Later?* Yes. Apply at any time during the school year. A child with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced-price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- 5. *What If My Income Is Not Always the Same?* List the amount <u>normally</u> received. If a household member lost a job or had hours/wages reduced, use current income.
- 6. We Are in The Military. Do We Report Our Income Differently? Basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. Any cash value allowances for offbase housing, food, or clothing, or Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance payments count as income. If housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include the housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is excluded from income.
- 7. *May I Apply If Someone in My Household Is Not a U.S. Citizen?* Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced-price meals.
- 8. *Will Application Information Be Checked?* Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the reported household income.
- 9. *My Family Needs More Help. Are There Other Programs We Might Apply For?* To find out how to apply for other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office or 2-1-1.
- 10. Can I Apply Online? Yes! The online application has the same requirements and will ask you for the same information as the paper application. Visit <u>www.nazarethisd.net/cafeteria</u> to begin or to learn more about the online application process. Menu items served after the point-of-service are considered a la carte and are not part of the reimbursable meal.

Meal payments may be made by students or parents <u>in advance</u> by bringing or mailing to the Administration Office or to the cafeteria. <u>Online payments</u> and low balance alerts may be set up through <u>www.myschoolbucks.com</u>; you will need your child's student ID number to set up online accounts. <u>Cash payments</u> may be made at the <u>end of the serving line</u>. Meals or food items may be <u>charged</u> <u>and billed</u> to the household. If a student owes more than \$45.00, a)2nd entrees may not be charged and b)choice of entrée is limited to the option of less cost.

Students may charge as needed, but all negative accounts need to be paid on monthly and paid-in-full by the end of each semester. Statements are sent out twice monthly for negative balances.

In compliance with federal non-discrimination guidelines, all students receive a copy of this Application Packet. However, only one application per household is needed if your household is applying for benefits.

If your household is eligible for free or reduced price meals based on your application, the effective date is the date the completed application is approved by the reviewing official—usually the day it is received. If your household is deemed eligible for free or reduced meals based on participation in a categorical program (SNAP, TANF, Medicaid, FDPIR, Migrant, Foster, Homeless), the effective date is the date when reviewed and approved by the reviewing official; if you do not receive a letter from school prior to August 21st, or transfer in later in the year, please submit an application indicating your categorical program status.

Our cashier and kitchen staff strive to recognize your child by name. The cashier is stationed at the end of the serving line, determines if the meal is reimbursable (must take a fruit or a vegetable plus two other components), and counts the meal by category. Students will use a keypad system and so will learn/retain their individual account numbers. Meals may be delivered to ISS; these meals are pre-packaged by school nutrition staff to ensure that proper serving sizes, vegetable subgroups, and other requirements are met. For field trips, please request bagged lunches at least one day in advance.

Directions for Applying For Free and Reduced-Price School Meals

Please use these instructions to complete the free or reduced-price school meals application. Submit one application per household, even if the children in the household attend more than one school in *Nazareth ISD*. Please use a **pen** (not a pencil) when completing the application. The application must be filled out completely in order for the school to make a determination if the children in your household qualify for free or reduced-price school meals. **An incomplete application cannot be approved**. Please contact *Carolyn Wilhelm, PO Box 189, Nazareth TX* with your questions.

Step 1: List All Household Members Who Are Infants, Children, And Students Up to and Including Grade 12.

• <u>List</u> each child's name.

<u>Print</u> first name, middle initial, and last name for each child in the household in the spaces. If there are more children than lines, use the back of the application to record additional names.

<u>Include</u> all household members who are age 18 or under and are supported with the household's income including children who are not enrolled in the district. Children do NOT have to be related to anyone in the household to be a part of the household.

- Mark the box following the child's name to show if the child is a student in the Nazareth ISD.
- <u>Record</u> the child's grade if the child is in school.
- <u>Check</u> the appropriate box if a child qualifies for free meals as participant in the foster care system, Head Start (including Early Head Start) or if a child meets the criteria for homeless, migrant, or runaway.

Checking Foster indicates that a foster care agency or court has placed the child in your home. If the application is being submitted for foster children only, complete Step 1, skip Step 2, and complete Step 3.

Participation in a Categorical Program

If all children in the household are participants in one of the following programs—*Foster, Head Start, Homeless, Migrant, or Runaway,* skip Step 2 and complete Step 3.

SNAP, TANF, and FDPIR: Do any household members (including you) currently participate in one or more of the following assistance programs: SNAP, TANF, or FDPIR?

If a child or adult in the household participates in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or Temporary Assistance to Needed Families (TANF), <u>record</u> the Eligibility Determination Group (EDG) number in the space.

If a child or adult in the household is a participant in Food Distribution Program for Households on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), <u>check</u> the box to indicate participation. The Nazareth ISD will contact you to obtain documentation of FDPIR participation.

• <u>Record</u> the amount of income the adult receives under the type of income: Working Earnings; Public Assistance/Child Support/Alimony; Pensions/ Retirement/Social Security/Supplemental Security Income (SSI); and All Other.

<u>Report</u> all amounts in gross income only and in whole dollars. Gross income is the total income received before taxes or deductions. Ensure that the income reported has not been reduced by the amounts deducted for taxes, insurance premiums, or any other purpose. - Write your current address and contact information in the space provided. Sharing a phone number, email address, or both is optional, but helps us reach you quickly if we need to contact you.

If you have no permanent address, this does not make your children ineligible for free or reduced-price school meals.

• Print the name of the adult signing the form, sign the form, and record today's date in the appropriate spaces.

All applications must be signed by an adult household member. By signing the

application, the household member is promising that all information has been truthfully and completely reported. Before completing this section, please read the privacy and civil rights statements on the back of the application.
